❖ Retirement of Dr. Linda Morgan



Linda Morgan, M.D.

Dr. Linda Morgan, Director of the Division of Gynecologic Oncology, retired in February after over 30 years of service. She was a J. Wayne Reitz Professor of Gynecologic Surgery from 2000-2013, and a Kibler Endowed Professor in Ovarian Cancer Research from 2013 until her retirement. She was recently awarded Professor Emeritus status.

Dr. Morgan's achievements as a physician were noted by many in the Gainesville community and beyond. She was included every year in the Best Doctors of America list from 1994-2015. Other honors include being named one of the 401 Best Doctors for Women by Good Housekeeping magazine in 1997, and one of 2002's "Outstanding Physicians in America" by Ladies Home

Journal. She was also consistently recognized for her teaching abilities, having earned both the APGO Excellence in Teaching and J. Lee Dockery, MD awards.

Born in Bloomington, IN, she attended medical school at the Medical College of Pennsylvania, and completed her residency training in Obstetrics and Gynecology here at the University of Florida College of Medicine. She then went on to complete a fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston. Throughout her career, her interests included treatment of gynecologic malignancies, robotic laparoscopic surgery, and reconstructive surgery in gynecology. Above all, Dr. Morgan was known as a physician who went above and beyond for her patients. When news of her retirement spread, numerous comments were posted on UF Health Women's Center's Facebook page from former patients and colleagues alike, such as the following from

former faculty member Dr. Judith Simms-Cendan: "Congratulations and well-deserved. OBGYNs around the country remember the way you treated your patients with compassion and honesty, in addition to admiring your skill (removing every tumor noogie). From hosting patients in your own home, to giving the patients chemo at theirs, you always fought for every woman. Thanks for being such an amazing role model."

We want to thank Dr. Morgan for her decades of service to the UF College of Medicine and the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology. But most of all, we'd like to thank her for improving the lives of her numerous patients throughout the years, and for being such a strong role model to many medical students and residents throughout her time here. Congratulations on your retirement, Dr. Morgan!

❖ Notes from the Chair

This July, I will have had the privilege of serving the University of Florida for 28 years. As I think back on the milestones of my career, I first remember my undergraduate acceptance at UNC, and subsequently my acceptance into medical school, also at UNC. When I decided in medical

school that I was going to train in Obstetrics and Gynecology, I had my future set! After marrying my college sweetheart, Peggy, I was then fortunate to be accepted at the Medical University of South Carolina for residency. After a rigorous but enjoyable 4 years, I then served with the US Air Force for 3 years at a small base hospital in Illinois doing general ObGyn, on call every other night and every other weekend. For 6 months I even became the only ObGyn, so I was then working 24/7.

During the middle of that tour I began thinking about my future after the USAF, and what did I love most in our specialty. I determined my passion was taking care of infertile patients. I was again very fortunate to be chosen for a fellowship in Reproductive Endocrinology and Infertility at the University of Louisville. After fellowship, with my increasing family (now two children, soon to be three) I was faced with the decision of

where to go and what type of practice to choose. As fate would have it, my Chairman at U of L, Jack Master-son, was being recruited to UF and invited me to join him as the REI Division Director. I have never looked back.

After 28 years, I am so thankful for the opportunities that UF has given to me and my family. I owe so much in return. As a small measure of our appreciation, Peggy and I have committed up to \$60,000 over the next 5 years to establish the ObGyn Discovery Fund in Obstetrics and Gynecology.

I invite all of you to join me in establishing this next major endowment in our Department so that we can fund the future of ObGyn research in our Department, including research by students, residents, fellows and faculty. We need several more major commitments and many other significant commitments in order to get to an endowment of at least \$500,000. Now is the time you can "pay back" for the opportunities you were given by your time spent at UF and the career you have enjoyed. Thanks.
